READING ALOUD

Reading aloud is one of the most important things parents and teachers can do with children. Reading aloud builds many important foundational skills, introduces vocabulary, provides a model of fluent, expressive reading, and helps children recognise what reading for pleasure is all about. The following outlines the '10 Benefits of Reading Aloud to Children' in a 3 part series over the next 3 weeks in our newsletter.

10 Benefits of Reading Aloud to Children

- Builds vocabulary While you may speak with your children every day, the vocabulary you use is often limited and repetitive. Reading books ensures that your child is exposed to vocabulary on different topics, which means they hear words or phrases which they may not hear otherwise in their day to day lives. The more words they know, the better.
- 2. **Improves reading comprehension** Reading to your children leads to questions about the book and the information within. It gives you a chance to speak about what is happening and use this as a learning experience. It may also develop an interest in different cultures or languages. There is nothing better seeing a child who loves to learn.
- 3. **Promotes empathy** When a child can put themselves into the story it helps them to develop empathy. They identify with characters, and they feel what they are feeling. Children begin to understand and relate to emotions.

HOME FIRE SAFETY PROGRAM - PREP TO GRADE 6

A firefighter from the Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) is visiting our school next week to present a Home Fire Safety Program to our Prep to Grade 6 students.

Kindergarten students, whilst not receiving a structured lesson, can expect a visit from the firefighter who will leave some free fun activities for the students to complete.

The age appropriate program is designed to raise fire awareness in children and includes fun in-class activities, videos, activity books, website www.tfseducation.com.au and giveaways.

Parents and other family members are also encouraged to participate by reading the information and assisting your child with the after school activities.

The TFS aims to deliver appropriate fire safety education to every primary school child in Tasmania and is part of the TFS's ongoing commitment to create a fire safe Tasmania.

Key Fire Safety Messages include:

Wake up - Install a smoke alarm in every bedroom

Keep matches and lighters away from children

Cooking - Turn it off before you turn away

Keep flammable material at least two metres from the heater

Plan and practice a home fire escape plan with the whole family

In an emergency call triple zero

In a fire crawl low and go, go, go to the nearest exit

Cool a burn under cold water for at least 20 minutes

If your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, rock and roll

Most house fires can be avoided. Make your home fire safe
