#### **NAPLAN ONLINE**

NAPLAN is moving completely online in 2019. This means moving NAPLAN from paper-based assessments to online-based assessments. NAPLAN Online will provide better assessment and more precise results. The assessments feature a tailored test design where the questions a student receives will depend on their answers to previous questions.



Tasmanian schools will participate in NAPLAN Online from 2019.

#### NAPLAN Online testing will be held from the 14 to 24 May 2019.

**NAPLAN Online 2019 will** include four components, Writing, Numeracy, Conventions of Language and Reading. For 2019 Year Three students will be completing a paper based Writing Test. Online Testing will be available for each of the NAPLAN year levels (3, 5, 7 and 9)

Schools will receive results and reports for participants following the completion of NAPLAN Online 2019. Individual Student Reports will have the same format as the results from the paper based testing. The same report format is used for every student in Australia.

Individual student performance in NAPLAN is shown on a national achievement scale for each test. The performance of individual students can be compared to the average performance of all students in Australia.

Security and privacy are key requirements for the delivery of national testing. The online assessment platform has been designed to comply with relevant national data security policies and guidelines as well as data encryption standards. It meets the requirements of the Australian Government's Protective Security Policy Framework and Information Security Manual to protect privacy of data, including any personal student data, required to be used.

#### LEARNING ABOUT NUMBERS IN THE EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL

Learning numbers is arguably the most important strand of Mathematics, as an understanding of number underpins all mathematics through the rest of school and throughout life. For this reason, developing strong understanding of the number system is a priority in the early years of learning.

During the next few weeks we will look at early counting skills and learning place value.

#### It doesn't matter what order objects are counted in, the answer will be the same.

Teachers call this the order-irrelevance principle. It means that it doesn't matter how you count a group of objects, you will always get the same number for the same group. It sounds obvious to adults, but young children may not yet have developed the understanding and it is a difficult one for young children to develop. Children need to learn that it doesn't matter where in a group you start counting from, for example, from left to right or from right to left, the number in the group will always stay the same. It also doesn't matter if you count a group of objects and then re-order them the group will still have the same number of objects. This is a normal developmental stage and one that all children go through.

Activities you can do with your child:

- Lay out a number of objects such as coins or counters in a small group. Have your child count them. Rearrange
  them and have your child count them again children will see for themselves that the number of objects doesn't
  change.
- Have your child count the same group of objects starting at different points and counting in different directions.
- Provide lots of opportunities to count items and then recount in multiple formats.

When children understand the principle, they won't need to count again, they will be able to tell you without re-counting. They will "trust the count".


#### **MYTERN - TAKE EMOTIONAL RESPONSIBILITY NOW**

 $MYTERN^{TM}$  is an emotional fitness skill that builds health and resilience through increasing emotional intelligence

#### It teaches:

- you are the only one who has control of your steering wheel
- every road you drive down represents a different emotion
- when you drive down Reapo's green roads, you gain health
- when you drive down Buska 's red roads you increase your driving skills and gain resilience
- when you drive down Buska's red roads for too long, you start to lose health
- your GPS is your emotion. It tells you which road that you are on
- you can sometimes find yourself out of control on either a red or a green road

You may not be able to change circumstances, but you always have the option to steer down a different road and change the way you feel.





#### MORE ABOUT USING 'WORD FAMILIES' TO DEVELOP VOCABULARY AND SPELLING

In the last article, we showed how classes have been using meaning strategies in their spelling work and across the other subject areas. Sometimes the pronunciation of the words changes, but the meaning stays the same. In the words fine, final, infinity, the fin meaning is the same (the end) but it sounds different. The words one, once, only, alone, none are all related by the meaning of 'one.' Learning in classrooms focuses on making connections between words using this meaning strategy to learn unfamiliar words. Students who rely only on 'sounding out' will limit their vocabulary and ability to spell unknown words which have no sound clues.






Grade 6-PF have been looking at bases which need more word parts to form a real word.
