

NEW STUDENT REPORT

Our teachers' commitment to and enthusiasm for a new report format for TPS has resulted in a revised report which will be issued mid-year, at the end of the year and into the future. During 2018 considerable time was dedicated to devising this report. We shared this with parents at the February School Association meeting where it was endorsed.

The main improvements of this report are that it provides:

- a breakdown of the different strands within a subject area (more specific information)
- more future focus areas
- an opportunity for strengths to be shown and celebrated and
- greater opportunity for gains to be acknowledged.

We aim to make it easier for parents/carers to see exactly where their child sits in each area of the curriculum. Student ratings are not compared with other students in the class. It shows progress using the achievement standard established for students across Australia.

The mid-year report of 2019 will be your introduction to this revised report.

CLASSROOM LIBRARIES

This week we are very excited to be able to distribute classroom libraries to each of our 3-6 classes. This initiative is part of the Middle Years Literacy Project and is aimed at enhancing student engagement in reading. During Term I, all students from Grade 4-6 participated in a reading survey and feedback was that children wanted more time and a greater variety of interesting texts to read. Children were given the opportunity to put forward the names of popular books and authors and we have been able to purchase most of these for the classroom libraries. In total, we have purchased over 500 books! A huge thankyou to Davina Lanham and Amy Gillettt for the hours they have spent covering the books. Next term we are hoping to set up classroom libraries in Early Childhood classes.

Fundraising by our School Association is enabling these Literacy improvements. We are extremely appreciative.

PATTERNING IN THE EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL

Learning about patterns is another important strand of Mathematics, for children to understand. Sorting, classifying and recognising patterns is a way that children make sense of the world around them and is an essential skill for future work in data analysis and Science.

Patterning

One of the reasons that humans have been so successful in their survival is because we are so good at recognising patterns. We know that the sun will rise and set each day. Our ancestors recognised the seasons of the year and they organised planning of their crops to fit.

Modern Science and Mathematics depends highly on pattern recognition and the ability to recognise patterns is necessary even in high level mathematics. Much of this ability is learnt in early childhood. This helps them to learn how to use logic and reasoning to make predictions. Knowing what has gone before and what will come next is very important in their daily lives and is essential in mathematics and science. Patterning also helps with language and is essential in music.

Activities to do with your child:

- Sing nursery rhymes these help with patterning. language, rhythm and music.
- Tell stories that have an element of repeat to them, that are predictable so that the children can tell you what comes next.

- Encourage your child to make patterns using rubber stamps, paw prints and footprints, making necklaces from beads, shell or pasta.
- Play clapping games.
- If you are at the beach look at patterns of footprints on the sand. Make patterns with your feet.
- Find items in the park or garden to make a pattern, such as leaf, leaf, stick.
- Make patterns as you walk, hop skip and jump.

Inside Out 4 Kids is an organisation which aims to assist children through the grief process when confronted with a painful loss or transition in their lives and/or families. When something significant happens in a family, everyone is affected, including the children. Because of young age and short life experiences, children often find it difficult to verbalise their feelings. The Inside Out 4 Kids is specifically designed for primary and high school students and is a peer support, harm-prevention program, offering a safe place to understand and share their feelings. Small groups of students meet with a trained adult facilitator once a week for 45 minutes during school hours and participate in activities including stories, talking, sharing, and craft. The following topics are covered:

Week I	– My Story – We are all unique
Week 2	 Emotions and Feelings – We all have feelings
Week 3	- Emotions, Feelings and Anger
	What makes you feel angry, directing anger appropriately.
Week 4	– My Heart, Grief & Loss- What's inside my heart, share our changes or loss
Week 5	- Memories & Moving on- Growing around the loss, share memories
Week 6	- I Belong, A Sense of Self Identity – Where do I belong, Who am I?
Week 7	- Courage & Resilience - What worries do I have, How to build resilience
Week 8	- New Horizons, Hope & Helping Others- Help with problem solving & change,
