On Monday 22nd our staff joined our cluster schools to continue our reading project learning with Dr lan Lillico. Some reminders we heard include:

- Reading helps children build resilience
- It is important that parents model reading at home as they play a crucial role in the reading development of their children
- It is important for both the father and mother to read to their children
- Relationships are crucial to the person being read to
- A relaxed environment greatly enhances the pleasure of reading
- Children engage most when there is a real purpose for reading

It is extremely positive that the data we have collected informs us that many of our students are very confident readers who really enjoy reading.

Our committed cleaning and grounds team has been working hard over the holidays. There is a great deal of progress to report:

- The student toilets opposite the staffroom have been painted and the improvement is substantial.
- Mr Trotman's Grade 4 classroom is freshly painted.
- The Kinder mural in the asphalt area has received undercoat, ready for further action. Watch this space!





- The **balcony on the eastern end of the library** has been removed, providing about two more metres of flat ground for play. How precious is this few metres?

- A new **Ga Ga Pit (handball)** has been installed above Prep/I WS classroom and what a hit this has been! I am sure you have already heard about it at home. 



LITERACY INVERVENTION

We are very fortunate at Trevallyn Primary School to offer a flexible program to assist Prep – Year 2 students with Literacy. Previously known as LLI (Levelled Literacy Intervention), we constantly review our data and use teacher observations to make decisions about which students may benefit from some small group Literacy Intervention.

Term I and 2:

During Term I and Term 2, Literacy Intervention focused on reading skills for Grade I students and both reading and writing skills for Grade 2 students. The results were extremely positive with **ALL** Grade I students making gains in their reading and comprehension levels. Two students gained 7 levels in reading, with one student gaining I0 levels. A parent information session was also held during the last week of Term 2 to help families of Prep children with literacy development. Fiona Cramp facilitated the session with our school Speech and Language Pathologist, Robyn Williams.

Term 3:

This term, approximately 24 students from Prep will be focusing on reading skills, oral language and phonological awareness. Several Grade I students will also receive some assistance with writing skills. Margaret Clark has already commenced the program for Term 3 and our Prep students are particularly excited to work in a small group. We are soon to purchase some high quality decodable readers which will help our beginning readers to decode and segment words and assist with their reading skills.

EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL - PATTERNING IN NUMERACY

Learning about patterns is another important strand of Mathematics for children to understand. Sorting, classifying and recognising patterns is a way that children make sense of the world around them and is an essential skill for future work in data analysis and Science.

Patterns in numbers

Two, four, six, eight, ten, twelve...

This is an example of what teachers call 'skip counting'. This helps children learn their 'number facts'. It also helps them to recognise the patterns in numbers. In our classrooms you will see a 100 chart. These support children's understanding of number and patterns numbers can create. How many patterns can you see? You can go across, down or diagonally.
