NAPLAN Results Grade 3 and Grade 5

Grade 3 and 5 students have delivered home their NAPLAN results this week.

Our overall school results are outstanding with the great percentage of our children making medium and high gains.

For example, in Grade 3 Reading, 81 % of students made medium or high gains and 90 % of students made medium or high gains in Numeracy.

In Grade 5 the gain percentage are:

REVIEW OF SCHOOL INTAKE AREAS - SECOND CONSULTATION ROUND

The Department is seeking your views as part of its ongoing review of school intake areas for Tasmanian government primary and combined (district) schools, applicable from 2021. This is the second stage of community consultation we will be holding prior to the maps being published.

Please note:

- Parents will still be able to apply to their school of choice, if capacity allows.
- The review will not change the way schools enrol students who live outside their intake area.
- The review will not affect students who are already enrolled in a school before 2021.
- If a child has a sibling already attending a school outside their intake area, then the child can enrol at the same school as their sibling.

We have developed a set of Proposed Intake Area Maps, based on feedback received on suggested intake area maps during the first consultation round. We invite the Tasmanian community to provide feedback on the new Proposed Maps by Friday, 27 September 2019.

The Education Act 2016 requires DoE to review intake areas at least once every five years. This requirement ensures that intake areas are regularly reviewed and remain current as communities and demographics change.

How to view Proposed Intake Area Maps

The Proposed Intake Area Maps are available to view via the:

- <u>intake area PDF maps</u> for each school showing the Proposed Intake Area
- <u>LIST Map Web App</u> (mobile device friendly) which provides an address search feature and access to a detailed, interactive map with layers to show the round I map and Proposed Intake Area. (Please note that at times of high demand functionality may be affected.)

How to provide feedback

We welcome your input as part of the review to inform any further necessary adjustments to the Proposed Intake Area Maps. All feedback will be considered by the Department.

Public feedback about the intake areas may be provided by completing the short <u>survey</u> by **Friday, 27 September 2019**. Alternatively, feedback can be provided by:






Intake Area Review – Round 2 Consultation

CLASS PLACEMENT AND CLASSES 2020

We are not far off beginning the task of organising classes for 2020.

Your child's current teacher is in the best position to formulate classes for next year. Grade teams, school leaders and the previous year teacher are also consulted in our class placement process. Our teachers take on board a number of considerations when placing students. Our goal is to create the most equitable classes possible, taking into account gender, learning ability, social connection, work habits, behaviour etc. Whilst parents have one child to consider (in a given class), we have approximately 500 children to consider next year, and so decisions need to be suitable for the majority. We have dedicated, hardworking teachers who are collectively responsible for all our children. No matter what grade or class – each child in this school will be taught by quality teachers in a school culture of high expectations. We will not be taking requests for students to be in particular classes or with specific students or teachers.

Teachers use a variety of methods to group children in order to maximise learning and the focus is always on the individual and personalising student learning. At Trevallyn we have been thoughtful about developing opportunities for students to interact and learn from one another – both within their own class and in conjunction with another or across grades. These observations inform us about the conditions that best suit a particular student to learn, which styles they have, who they are friends with; who they learn best with. We consider all these factors when placing children in classes for the following year.

Please understand, teachers will make the best decision for all children in the school – including what we believe is in the educational and social/emotional well-being of the children. We are **unable** to accommodate personal requests because accommodating everyone's personal wishes will not support what is best for **all** children. CLASS PLACEMENT POLICY

Trevallyn Primary School is committed to meeting the educational needs of all students. A great deal of thought, planning and time goes into placing children into classes each year. Every effort is made to place each child in a learning environment that is happy, safe, productive and successful.



Factors influencing class structures are:

- The projected number of students in each year level
- The number of teachers employed at the school and available facilities

Factors which are considered in the placement of students include:

- The educational needs of the students
- · Work habits e.g. ability to work independently, within groups
- Behaviour
- Gender
- Social networks
- Students with Disabilities e.g. required learning adjustments, Teacher Assistant allocations, Learning Plans (LP's).

This policy supports the school to organise classes to cater for a range of academic abilities, opportunities for new social connections, work habits and to foster diversity.

Parents are invited, in a defined timeframe, to outline educational requests for class placements. Requests in relation to choice of teacher will not be considered as a placement factor.

What is the process for placing students into classes?

Based on the criteria listed above, teaching staff will meet early **Term 4** to establish class groupings for the following school year. Teachers of the current year level and school leaders meet with the other year level colleagues to create the class lists. (E.g. Year 2 teachers and school leaders decide Year 3 placements)

Throughout the process, changes and adjustments are made. Each change triggers a chain reaction of other changes. It is acknowledged by all that friendships are important. However, to ensure balanced classes as outlined above, friendship groups are NOT the primary determining factor in class placement. Proposed class lists are submitted to the Leadership Team for final input and endorsement.

EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL - MATHEMATICS

The Operations

P-B

Only after children have learnt to count and they have become fluent counters and understand the written form of numbers, they can begin to learn about the operations – learning to add, subtract, multiply, divide and so on.

Teaching Multiplication

Multiplication is an important skill that children begin to develop early in school. We know from research that it is better for children to understand and learn strategies for multiplication before they rote learn their multiplication facts. This is to ensure that children do not have trouble later in their schooling when they need to use multiplication for more advanced mathematics.

Children are introduced to multiplication in there ways: repeated addition, groups and arrays.


Repeated addition

Children need to learn the relationship between addition and multiplication so that they understand what multiplications is. As your child is already familiar with addition, the teacher will use that to build understanding.

2 + 2 + 2 + 2 is the same as 4 lots of 2 or 4×2 which is 8

We can show this with counters;





Groups

This looks similar to repeated addition but is more difficult because it doesn't allow the child to use addition in the same way and encourages multiplication strategies.







Here we have 3 groups of 4 ladybirds or 3 (number of groups) x 4 (number in each group) which is 12.

Arrays

Arrays work to organise groups so that they look more like multiplication and are in a form that children use later for other mathematics learning. This is an example of an array below. This array show 3 rows of 4 dots. So we say 3 rows of 4 is 12 dots, or 3 x 4 is 12.
