FROM THE PRINCIPAL

On Sunday 15 September, eight Grade 5 and 6 students competed in the **Mathematics Association of Tasmania** annual **Maths Relays.** Students competed in two teams of four against 34 other teams from various northern primary schools. Students were given 45 minutes to answer 20 complex mathematical questions. Both Trevallyn teams performed exceptionally well and we were incredibly proud of them.

At the completion of the relay, Team A attempted 19 of the 20 questions and received a total of 115 points. Team B, placed 1st for the northern teams with a perfect score of 200, completing all questions with 4 minutes and 30 seconds remaining. This result placed them 3rd at a State level. What an incredible achievement!

REVIEW OF NATIONAL FUNDING ARRANGEMENTS FOR KINDERGARTENS: SURVEY FOR PARENTS

An independent review (the Review) is being conducted into the national funding arrangements that support access by all children in Australia to 600 hours per year of quality early childhood education in the year before full-time school.

For Tasmania this is our Kindergarten year. Since 2008, the Australian Government's UANP funding has supported an increase to 15 hours per week of Kindergarten in Tasmania, however the future of national funding is uncertain beyond 2020.

Tasmania has a long and proud history of providing free access to quality early learning and the Tasmanian Government has made substantial investments to support and expand this provision.

It is important that the success of Kindergarten in Tasmania is clearly understood in this national process and we encourage the Tasmanian education community, including parents, teachers, and leaders to participate in the review.

EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL - MATHEMATICS

The Operations

Only after children have learnt to count and they have become fluent counters and understand the written form of numbers, they can begin to learn about the operations – learning to add, subtract, multiply, divide and so on.

Teaching division

Division is not taught as division in the early years of school. Children are introduced to the notion of sharing in preparation for learning about division.

The key idea that children need is that sharing means dividing things equally (this is important for fractions too). Children need to see lots of different things (and things that look different) being shared.

Multiplication and sharing activities to do with your child:

Until your child has a good understanding of multiplication, it is best not to spend time practising multiplication facts or 'times tables'. This can actually limit children's understanding. So plan opportunities where children can multiply smaller numbers by using groups. Keep an eye on the progression at school. Some children see patterns quickly and others take a little longer. So if you know your child's teacher is working groups of 2 then you would be playing games around groups of two.

- If I want two lollies for each person in the family, how many do I need? (Have your child put them out) "Two for Mum, two for Jack, two for Jan? How many?"
- Think about sharing items. We have 12 Iollies and want to share them with all the people (4) in our family. How can we share them fairly?
- We have a pizza cut into 8 pieces and there are 4 of us. How many pieces does each person have?














TOGETHER WE INSPIRE AWARDS 2019


