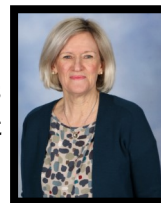


FROM THE PRINCIPAL CONTINUED

THE IGENERATION: KIDS AND SCREENS - MASTERCLASS FOR PARENTS

We were very fortunate to have Maxine Lowry from Parenting Plus, facilitate The iGeneration: Kids and Screens 'Masterclass' for Parents at Trevallyn Primary on Tuesday 22 October. Maxine shared valuable and thought provoking information which generated wonderful discussion with the group of parents in attendance. Some key 'take aways' from the session were

- Connection, spending time with your children to develop and maintain relationships and communication is crucial
- "Families who eat together stay together". Create some family routines or rituals that enable conversation and time together
- Consider your own tech habits as parents, grandparents and guardians
- Screentime verses 'green' time, a balance of outdoor and indoor activities
- Be aware and involved with your child/children's screentime and access online
- Establish clear timeframes and expectations with screentime for your household
- Keep technology out of bedrooms (including TV's)
- Have some technology free days
- "Listen to your child in a non-judgemental way"

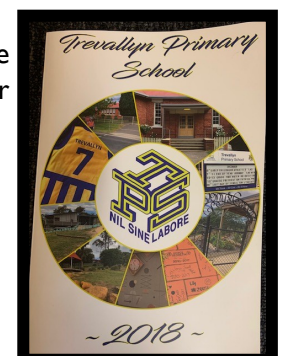
The Trevallyn Primary School Yearbook is a high quality, full colour magazine which is professionally published.

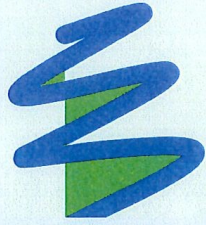

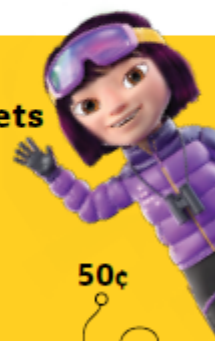
