## DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION STUDENT AWARDS 2019 (FORMERLY NAPLAN AWARDS)

Recently, Mrs Bransden and I had the privilege of attending a celebration event hosted by Learning Services Northern Region to recognise achievement and the values of aspiration and growth.

Lilly Kelly received a Growth Award, recognising her progress over time, identifying her demonstrated significant academic growth. This award considers her growth in literacy and numeracy over 2-3 years between tests in Prep and Years 3 and 5, as well as her Australian Curriculum teacher assessments in English, Mathematics and Science for 2018/2019.

Aspiration and Achievement Awards (previously referred to as Top 1% Awards) were presented to Luke de Boer, Matilda Ryan, Oscar Blyth, Lilly Kelly, Heidi Curtis and Daisy Barbour. This award considered student achievement in NAPLAN literacy and numeracy testing and Australian Curriculum teacher assessments in English, Mathematics and Science for 2018/2019.

### Students will need to bring the following items:


- Bathers – one piece or two piece with rash vest



## MAX FRY HALL COMMITTEE REQUEST

Many of you are no doubt familiar with the Max Fry Hall. It was built 50 years ago by the local community for the local community and is owned by the Trevallyn Community Hall Trust Inc. and managed by a very small group of volunteers, some of whom have reached their use by date! There is an annual hire agreement in place with Trevallyn Primary School, that permits the school to use it when they require it, and it is available for hire Monday to Sunday at all other times. The school does not have an assembly hall so for many years the hall has supplied their needs. However school numbers have now reached close to 500 pupils and the maximum capacity for the hall is 360, so full school assemblies are no longer possible, but it is used for other curricular activities.

The present committee think the hall should remain as a community asset and to this end have been seeking ways, such as grants, to give it some T.L.C., like a new roof, to preserve it for future generations. We are seeking assistance from people living in the area who can spare one evening a month to help with the management and inject some new ideas into the process. 
