## END OF YEAR REPORTS

End of Year Reports will be going home with all Prep to Grade Six students next Wednesday 11 December. The End of Year reports summarise your child's overall end-of-year results. Your child will receive an assessment based on the descriptions below for English, Mathematics, History and Science. It reflects their progress and achievement against the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards.

End of Year Reports for Kindergarten students will go home Wednesday 11 and Thursday 12 (depending on your child's days) and are written against the Early Years Learning Framework Outcomes.

Below is a guide to assist you with your understanding of your P-6 child's assessment.

A guide to Understanding your Child's Assessment	
<b>A - Well above the standard expected</b>	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
<b>B - Above the standard expected</b>	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
<b>C - At the standard expected</b>	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved the expected level of competence in the processes and skills.
<b>D - Approaching the standard expected</b>	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.
<b>E - Below the standard expected</b>	The student has elementary knowledge and understanding in a few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

## CHICKENPOX

Confirmed reporting of Chickenpox has occurred in upper primary. Please read the following information.

### What are the symptoms?

Chickenpox starts with a fever, sometimes with a headache or stomach ache. A day or so later, spots appear on the skin, often starting on the head and middle of the body then spreading to arms and legs. The spots form little blisters which are usually itchy. They then become cloudy and form crusty scabs.

Some people who have had chickenpox vaccine do develop chickenpox after exposure to someone with the illness. Chickenpox in this situation is usually mild because the vaccination still provides some protection.

Someone with chickenpox is contagious for at least one or two days before the rash starts. They are contagious until the blisters form scabs, about five days after the rash started. Students with chickenpox are excluded from school until all blisters have dried (usually about 5 days).

Your GP or Public Health will be able to answer any further questions that you might have about chickenpox.

## LSSSA 5/6 SWIMMING CARNIVAL

On Friday 29 November, a team of students from Grade 5/6 attended the Division A LSSSA swimming carnival at Riverside Pool. The team was selected based on the results from our school carnival. In a strong competition, our Trevallyn team performed very well finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> overall. We had some fantastic individual swimming results in Heat 1 from Matilda B (1<sup>st</sup> in freestyle; 3<sup>rd</sup> in backstroke), Mason L (3<sup>rd</sup> in freestyle; 1<sup>st</sup> in breaststroke), Charlie H (3<sup>rd</sup> in freestyle, backstroke and 99m) and Briely M-S (3<sup>rd</sup> in freestyle and 99m). In the relays, our Grade 5 girls team came 2<sup>nd</sup> and our Grade 5 boys team came 3<sup>rd</sup>. Congratulations to all students involved - you represented the school exceptionally well.

## SCIENCE - FORCE AND MOTION POSTERS

<b>Friction</b> Friction is a force that is created when two objects or surfaces try to move or slip across each other.  Pulling a box up a grassy hill.	<b>Gravity</b> Gravity is the force that pulls objects towards Earth.  Two people jumping on a trampoline.
<b>Motion</b> Motion is where an object has a change in position.  Bouncing a ball on a wall.	<b>Force</b> Force is a push or pull in a particular direction.  Swinging on a swing.
<b>Push</b> Push is the force you use to move an object away from you.  Pushing a box.	<b>Pull</b> Pull is the force you use to move an object towards you.  Pulling your dog on a leash.

<b>Motion</b> A change of movement to a different position.  Jumping over a hurdle.	<b>Acceleration</b> How much speed changes in a certain amount of time.  Rolling down a hill.
<b>Gravity</b> Gravity is when objects are pulled down to the ground.  Falling leaves.	<b>Push</b> Push is a force that makes objects move away from you.  Pushing a swing.

<b>GRAVITY</b> The Earth's gravity is pulling objects to the ground but in space if you release a ball then it will never stop moving because there is no gravity in space.  Gravity in space.	<b>Force</b> A push or pull in a particular direction. push pull  Pushing and pulling.
<b>MOTION</b> When you throw a ball at the wall really hard it bounces back. This is called elastic force. It stores its energy and bounces back.  Bouncing ball.	<b>Acceleration</b> Acceleration is when an object changes speed.  Accelerating car.

<b>Inertia</b> An object that is currently in resting.  Resting door.	<b>Acceleration</b> The amount of speed that is changed in a certain amount of time.  Accelerating school bus.
<b>Friction</b> A force that is made when two objects try and move across each other.  Sliding down a slide.	<b>Motion</b> An object that changes its position.  Jumping.
<b>Push</b> A force that makes objects move away from you.  Pushing a swing.	<b>Pull</b> A force that makes objects come closer to you.  Pulling a rope.
<b>Gravity</b> The force that pulls things down to earth.  Sitting on a chair.	<b>Force</b> A push, pull or stab in a certain direction.  Pushing a boat.

<b>Force</b>  Pulling a dog.	<b>Motion</b> Changing positions quickly.  Running.
<b>Pull</b>  Pulling a rope.	<b>Push</b> When you push something it may or may not fall.  Pushing a car.
