



COVID-19 Term 3 Arrangements

To help understanding of COVID-19 arrangements for TPS at the beginning of Term 3, I have tabled the main topics with an explanation.

Screening consists of a one page question sheet that requires a visitor signature and 4 questions of self-declaration. The purpose is to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in our community and reduce the risk of exposure to our learners, staff and visitors. It is a precautionary measure to protect the visitor and everyone on this site. If the answer to any of the questions is "yes", the visitor will be unable to visit our site in person at this time.

No staff member, student or parent/carer who is unwell should be on our school grounds. This includes, signs of fever, e.g. sweats, chills, shortness of breath or cold or flu-like symptoms.
















FROM THE PRINCIPAL CONTINUED

Topic	What we are planning to do for the beginning of Term 3
Attendance	Normal attendance requirements will apply. Formal attendance alerts will be applied.
Parent/carer drop off and collect – access to classrooms	This will continue at the school gate. Current regulations allow parents to access school grounds and classrooms for very brief periods of time, with physical distancing applying. As this is not manageable in our school setting due to unavoidable congestion in various access points, parents will continue with "Drop, Stop and Go" and "Collect and Go." Support for Early childhood children to enter school each morning will continue. We have experienced many positives for children and parents with these arrangements in the later part of Term 2, the greatest being a considerable growth in confidence and independence of our students. Email and phoning will continue to be the main mode of parent-teacher communication.
Parent/Teacher Meetings	These can occur with a focus on physical distancing and hygiene practices. Screening will apply. TPS's plans established late in Term 2 will continue early in Term 3.
Parent and Community Volunteers	With Principal approval, volunteers can support, with a focus on physical distancing and hygiene practices. Screening will apply.
School assemblies	Will be rescheduled without parent attendance due to physical distancing challenges.
LIL Launching Into Learning	Will occur on site subject to physical distancing and hygiene practices. Screening will apply.
School Association Meeting	Will occur with physical distancing and hygiene practices. Screening will apply. Principal encourages a remote/online option from Term 3.
Visitors	Can occur if deemed essential and physical distancing and hygiene practices are a focus. Screening will apply.
Excursions	Can occur with consideration to gathering restrictions, physical distancing and hygiene requirements.
Canteen	The canteen will be open Term 3. Please refer to canteen menu on page 7.
Sport and Activities	These can take place including competitions aligned with current health advice. Inter-school events and competitions can take place.
