

The Student Free Day on July 20 was a much appreciated opportunity for teachers to learn and plan together. The focus for all teachers was the hugely important area of Speaking and Learning within our curriculum. Every grade team developed a focus area for this term. Teachers and Assistants shared their expertise to build knowledge across all grades. This will aid consistency in teaching as well as in assessing students' skills. Students who have been doing oral presentations in their classrooms have viewed themselves on video and acted on teacher and peer feedback to make improvements in pace, clarity and body language. Resources have been purchased to support classroom and small group programs.

Parent/Teacher Meetings – please let us know if there are questions resulting from Parent/Teacher conversations that have been conducted during the last two weeks. Your child's class teacher is the appropriate first point of contact. Earlier in the year some parents had concerns that COVID Term 2 changes would impact on student progress and learning. I am very relieved to inform you that this has not occurred and that overall our student results indicate expected progress. This is a credit to everyone, the students, families and teachers as Term 2 required a collective effort for educational provision.

School Physical Improvements

During the holidays the following improvements were completed:

- A block kitchen painted
- Lighting in the library and staff room upgraded
- Carpet in Prep/Grade I corridor replaced
- Decking replaced staffroom, 3/4W, 3/4A and 3/4D
- Outside Multi-Purpose Room roof area waterproofed for more dry undercover area
- PA speaker system improved new speakers outside Grade 2 and in back of Prep area
- New pin boards installed in $3 \times 5/6$ classrooms

Australian City Farms and Community Gardens Network Project

Students have recently planted approximately 100 diverse local understorey species in our school bush and gardens. We have been thrilled to be part of the "Habitat for Birds Project." The aim is to encourage birds into our school garden food growing areas to forage and control insects and enhance organic food growing.



















FLEXIBLE LEARNING PROGRAM

At Trevallyn Primary School we are fortunate to be able to implement a range of Flexible Programs across all grades. Many students enjoy the opportunity to develop life skills in a safe and supportive environment. Our Girls' Craft Club is a place for some of our girls to connect with others and talk about everyday life. They problem solve together and plan for success. In our Gross Motor programs, students enjoy our new outdoor classroom. They can ride bikes, throw and catch, climb, build and move freely to explore their environment while developing turn taking and communication skills.

Our Music Therapy sessions are fun and inviting and allow for students to express themselves through music. During these sessions, students learn how to relax and be mindful. Our cooking programs have been a huge success with students working as a team to create appetising outcomes. Many have tried new things and they enjoy sharing what has been made with their family. Our new Technology Group has been a highlight for the term. It will be exciting to see what this group creates. Continuing on from last term is our Bush Inquiry Group. The students enjoy exploring our wonderful bush playground and are responsive to the quiet time in nature to ask questions and reflect.



LITERACY INTERVENTION

Literacy Intervention is a small-group intervention program at Trevallyn Primary School where students in Grades Prep – Two are supported with instruction in reading, writing and phonics/word study. We constantly review our data and use teacher observations to make decisions about which students may benefit from some small group Literacy Intervention. During Terms One and Two, 25 students accessed the Literacy Intervention program. The results were extremely positive with all of these students significantly improving their reading levels. At the end of Term 2, 7 students exited the program, having reached a grade appropriate reading level.

During Terms Three and Four, students from Prep will be focusing on reading skills, oral language and phonological awareness. Grade One and Two students will continue their focus on reading and writing skills with our priority being the continued work to support the literacy needs of students reading below benchmark level for their grade.

UNIFORM SHOP


