By the end of 2022 all educators will foster learners agency through concept based (inquiry) teaching and learning cycles and provide a range of positive experiences so that all learners are challenged, have a sense of value and connection to learning through deliberate collaboration with peers, teachers and community.

By the end of 2022 all learners use feedback to identify and articulate their next steps (how) in learning (Literacy, Numeracy and Learner Assets) so that the Trevallyn Instructional Model is embed, driven by evidence and data and focuses on all learners progressing in learning through goal setting with teachers and parents.

NAPLAN ONLINE 2021

The National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) was first undertaken as an online test in Tasmania during 2019. Tasmanian schools will again participate in NAPLAN Online this year.

NAPLAN Online provides better assessment and more precise results. The assessments feature a tailored test design where the questions a student receives will depend on their answers to previous questions.

NAPLAN testing will be held from the II to 21 May 2021.

Online testing will be available for each of the NAPLAN year levels (3, 5, 7 and 9).

NAPLAN assessments include four components, Writing, Numeracy, Conventions of Language and Reading. Please note that all Year Three students will be completing a paper-based Writing Test.

Schools will receive reports and results for participants following the completion of the NAPLAN Online assessment window. These Individual Student Reports will have the same format as in previous years. This format is used for every student in Australia.

A parent/carer brochure containing more information about the NAPLAN Online assessments, will be distributed by the school to families of students sitting NAPLAN this year.

INSPIRE A WRITER

Last TOPICS we had a list about lists! Here are some more ideas to get your child enjoying purposeful writing at home.

Cards and letters are fun ways to communicate. This writing has a natural audience – it is intended for someone else to read. This means you can encourage clear spacing, consistent letter size and other goals dependent on age and stage because it has a message for another person to read. Adding drawings helps give children more to write about.

 Make a card for an elderly person in your street. Include some lovely drawings and a description of what you have drawn. Write a clear cheery message and sign your name.

- Make an Easter card for their buddy at school. All students have a buddy class, either in older or younger grades.
- Write a letter to a pen-pal. Team up with another parent and get your kids to get to know each other the old-fashioned way. This is a good way of learning your home address and practising capitals letters for proper nouns (age and stage).
- Write a letter with the purpose of giving your opinion. The council would love your thoughts on Riverbend Park or the opening hours of the Riverside pool. Make suggestions of things that could be changed.
- Write a letter to your school principal. Let them know what things you love about your school and what helps you learn best.

There could be a million topics for cards and letters. They can be for a different purpose and this is discovered in school or at home by thinking about how to entertain, inform or persuade an audience. If you mail them at the post office, you might even get a treat!

"Why can't we release the butterfly straight away?"


We also considered what our butterflies would need when we released them and designed a butterfly friendly garden around our school kitchen garden.






