#### SPEAKING AND LISTENING FAMILY ACTIVITY

Speaking and listening are crucial forms of communication, alongside reading and writing. The development of oral language should not be left to chance; it is explicitly taught in classrooms and is developed through play, inquiry and social relationships. Here is an activity that will develop oral language skills along with inquiring and developing a sense of belonging.

### Interview someone in the family

What you will need:

- · paper and pencil
- a phone or device to call a family member or friend.

#### What to do:

- 1. Help your child to write some interview questions, to ask an older family member or friend, about what things were like when they were young. It may be helpful to choose a focus, such as toys, work, household objects and appliances.
- 2. Ask about what people did with their leisure time, school, transport, radio and TV, music, famous people, major events, how they celebrated birthdays and so on.
- 3. Arrange to contact a family member or friend via phone or video chat app. (eg Skype, Messenger, Face time, Zoom, etc). If possible, record the interview.
- 4. Ask your child to answer the same questions themselves. Compare their answers with the family members. What is really different? What is similar?

### Want to go further?

Do some research about any of the objects or events the person mentioned.

Make a presentation to share with the family. This could be a PowerPoint presentation or write a story, make a poster, a photo display or a drawing, etc.

### What learning is happening:

This History activity helps children to understand the past and stories from their own family history. Children will learn to ask questions, do research, make connections, compare and contrast as they reflect and communicate their learning with the family.


