Our Support Staff




Tell us what you think

- Self-regulation is the ability to understand and manage your own behaviour and reactions.
- Self-regulation helps children and teenagers learn, behave well, get along with others and become independent.
- Self-regulation begins to develop rapidly in the toddler and pre-schooler years. It continues to develop into adulthood.
- Ways to develop your child's self-regulation include talking, planning, problem-solving and role-modelling.

MID-YEAR REPORTING INFORMATION 2021

Mid-Year Reports will be going home with all Prep to Six students on Wednesday 30th June. The Mid-Year Reports provide parents with an assessment based on the descriptions below for English, Mathematics and Science. It reflects their progress and achievement against the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards. It also provides Future Focus areas to assist your child in achieving the best possible outcomes in their learning.

The aim of the Trevallyn Primary School reporting format is to make it easier to see exactly where your child sits in each subject area of the curriculum. The slider is there to support the understanding of your child's strengths and areas needing improvement. Each slider **does not** have equal weighting. The overall rating on your child's report is an on-balanced judgement made by your child's teacher/s.

The benefits of the format of this report is that it provides:

- A breakdown of the different strands within a subject area (more specific information)
- More future focus areas
- An opportunity for strengths to be shown and celebrated and
- Greater opportunity for gains to be acknowledged

Mid-Year Reports for Kindergarten students will be sent home with students on Wednesday 16th and Thursday 17th June. These reports consist of a short general comment and the Kindergarten Development Checklist 1.

Below is a guide to assist you with your understanding of your child's assessment.

Assessment Scale		
A - Well above the standard expected	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.	
B - Above the standard expected	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.	
C - At the standard expected	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved the expected level of competence in the processes and skills.	
D - Approaching the standard expected	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.	
E - Below the standard expected	The student has elementary knowledge and understanding in a few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

VITAL VOCABULARY

'Vocabulary' refers to the words we must understand to communicate effectively. Vocabulary relates to listening, speaking, reading and writing.

Vocabulary is essential when learning how to read. Beginning readers must use the words they hear orally to make sense of the words they see in print. Kids who hear more words spoken at home learn more words and enter school with better vocabularies.

Children learn vocabulary indirectly by engaging in daily oral language, by reading on their own and being read to. At school, vocabulary is also taught directly. It can relate to units of inquiry (volcanoes, lava, magma etc are all 'topic' words), it can relate to a language about learning ('bump it up', feedback, goals etc relate to the language of learning growth) and it is taught as part of learning in English about how words are formed and evolve. For example, base words (eg friend) or words with Latin roots (eg rupt – to burst) are all built upon with the same meaning connections.

Family Challenge

See how many related words (must have the same meaning) you can create for these Latin roots.

*rupt (to burst)

*dict (to speak)

*pend (to hang)


