FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Celebrating Learning

Over the last two weeks Ms Hudson and I have been spending more time in classrooms. We have enjoyed and learnt so much about concept based inquiry, learner assets and students agency across the school.

Our School Captains have also been involved, taking the Department of Education's Secretary Tim Bullard and Deputy Secretary Trudy Pearce on a Learning Walk through the school last week. They showcase the deep learning through inquiry happening in 3 Bender/Hudson and 5/6 Bransden.

Grade 1/2 Hepburn were busy collecting Census data this week. After discovering and sharing their understandings of what the Census is, the students set to work to collect their own information. This lesson was incredibly engaging with children creating physical people graphs, designing questions, collecting data and even using spreadsheets to create pie graphs. As an educator it was a joy to witness the children completely connected to their learning through this lesson.

Duty of Care – Mornings and Afternoons cont...

Trevallyn Primary School hours are from 8:30 am through to 3:10 pm, Class hours 9:00 am – 3:00 pm. It is important that parents do not bring children to school before school hours because there is no supervision of students at that time. Similarly, it is important parents either collect their children at the end of the school day or arrange for them to catch the bus home/make other collection arrangements so that students are not left unsupervised at the end of the school day. Children's safety is our priority and unsupervised students may engage in or put themselves in dangerous positions/locations such as car parks being used by buses and cars during school drop off/pick up. Parents are responsible for their children outside school hours unless they have accessed school based child care during these times.

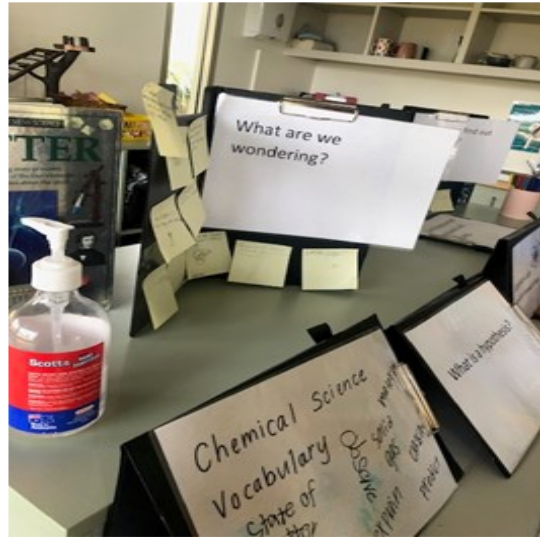
Cost: \$25 per student (no extra cost to enter both individual and team events)

In 3 Bender/Hudson we are learning about Chemical Sciences. While we are doing so we are becoming more efficient researchers and self-managers.



In Grade One Reid/Mitchell we have been learning to write a narrative. We are learning that a good story always includes a beginning, middle and an end. At the beginning of a narrative we find out who the characters are and where the story takes place. The problem goes in the middle of the story and the solution at the end. Trevallyn's Great Book Week Book Swap

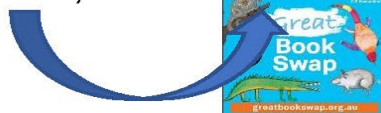


Calling parents and kids for a book clear out!
