Wow what a start to the year! We are delighted to have everyone back at school. As we shift and adjust to being at school with



All students are exploring the concept of identity, creativity, and wellbeing. Students will be exploring key concepts such as expression, wellbeing, change, identity, choices, and personal responsibility. Wellbeing and social and emotional development are integral to children's learning. Emotional regulation (or self-regulation) includes all the skills and mindsets that allow us to be present and ready for learning, ready to be with friends and ready to be the best versions of ourselves.

It includes being able to:

- regulate reactions to strong emotions like frustration, excitement, anger and embarrassment
- calm down after something exciting or upsetting
- focus on a task
- refocus attention on a new task
- control impulses

Through the students' inquiry they will discover they already have tools with in themselves to be SELF-MANAGERS, COMMUNICATORS, COLLABORATORS, THINKERS AND RESEARCHERS. DUTY OF CARE

We are utilising outdoor areas for lessons all day. Please help us by not coming onsite to wait for pick up prior to 2:55pm. We know these changes mean we must adjust the way we do things across the school. Please be assured that we are looking at ways you can connect with your classroom teachers and your child's learning. A revision of the current circumstances will take place prior to Week 5 and we will keep you up to date along the way.

Rapid Antigen Test Information

Your go-to guide to rapid antigen tests

This guide has been developed to support families using rapid antigen tests (RATs).

How to access more RATs

All students now have two RATs as part of their COVID-19 care pack. As you use your supply of RATs, parents and carers must ask for more RATs at the school office. Each student has access to two RATs per week if requested.

It's important to note that if you have run out of school issued RATs, and your child has symptoms, please don't attend school to collect a RAT. Instead, we encourage you to reach out to the Tasmanian Public Health Hotline on 1800 671 738 to obtain a RAT. Thank you for your cooperation on this.

How to use a RAT

Your child only needs to use a RAT if they have <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>. If your child has COVID-19 symptoms, they must stay at home and use a RAT.

Please refer to Public Health's easy-to-follow instructions on how to use a RAT. In the information pamphlet contained in your rapid antigen test, under section 6.0 there is an instruction stating 'you must take a laboratory PCR test immediately' if your RAT tests positive. Public Health assures us that school staff and students do not need to do a PCR test if their RAT tests positive.

What to do with your test result

If a negative result is returned, and your child is feeling well, they can attend school.

If your child tests COVID-19 positive, you must immediately let us know, and <u>complete the Public Health form</u>. You must follow <u>Public Health advice</u>. During your child's isolation period, if they feel well they can access learning via the Virtual Learning Centre.

If someone in your household tests COVID-19 positive, you must immediately let us know that your child is a close contact and <u>follow Public Health instructions</u>. Your child can access learning via the Virtual Learning Centre during this time.
