This year our staff have been delivering teaching and learning of the Australian Curriculum through a lens of Inquiry. Our goal as a school is to engage every learner into deep learning through Learner Agency and Inquiry, so that every learner grows more than a year in both Literacy and Mathematics.



We know that this is very much teacher talk, and we want to share some of our insights with you.

Inquiry gives teachers and students the tools to engage with the key concepts of the Australian Curriculum so that students develop deep understandings from across the curriculum. It is important to know that Explicit Instruction (teaching) of core literacy and numeracy skills are still the focus of every classroom. These skills are linked to the skills students develop through the "Learner Assets".

ESK BAND COMBINED WORKSHOP

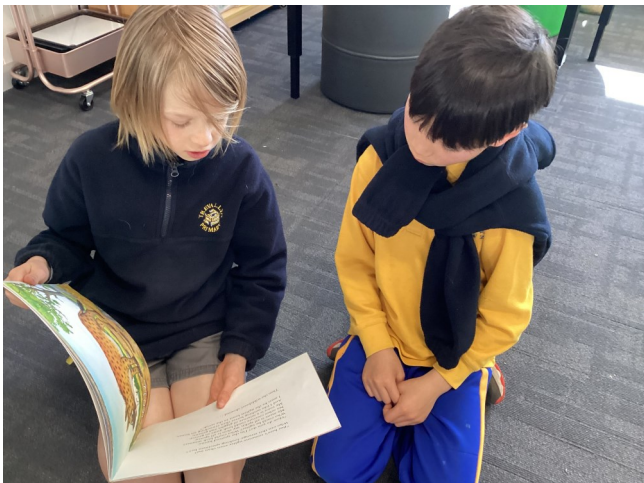

Our students performed at a very high level.



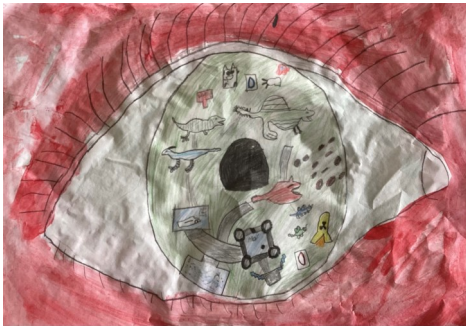
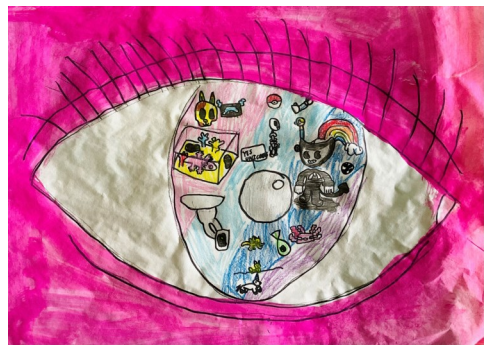
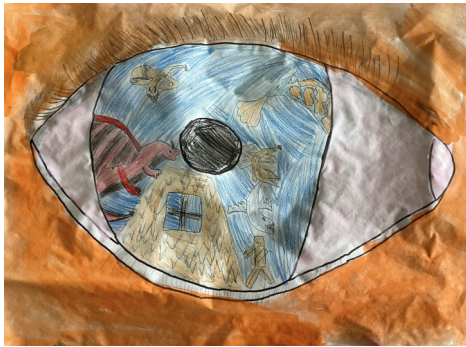
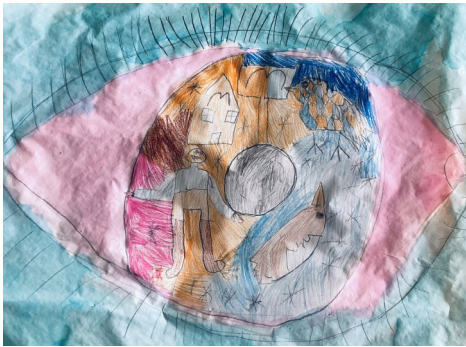
BUDDY CLASSES - 5-6 MARSHALL AND 1-2 OLIVER/COYLE
