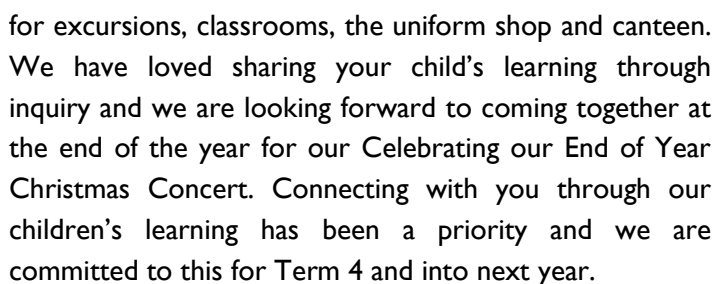

As you all know Trevallyn is a wonderful school community! This term has been an extraordinary example of this. Our school days are filled with delight as you drop your children off at school, come and volunteer



Our staff are exceptional! This week they have been examining our work on School Improvement. They have identified our strengths and improvements delivering Learner Agency through Inquiry and how Feedback has supported children's learning. Next term we will be examining student growth data for reading and numeracy to understand how we have supported Trevallyn Students to learn more than a year over 2022 and identify areas of improvement for teaching and learning. We will examine the results of our Satisfaction Surveys for both staff and parents and identify trends over time from the student wellbeing data. We are continuing our focus on Learner Agency through Inquiry and Feedback next term; we are looking forward to hearing from you and our students about this work and how this has supported children's positive experiences and connection to learning.



FROM THE PRINCIPAL..

A SHOUT OUT TO TONY

Every day Tony looks out for us and our safety. He greets the children with a great big hello, setting them up for a great day at school. We love his enthusiasm and genuine care for our community. Please remember to ALWAYS cross at the school crossing with Tony. We understand that drop off and pick up can be tricky to navigate, so please make sure you:

- Remember to always cross at the crossing
- Never duck across the road in a different spot
- Model safe road behaviours to all our students
- Ensure you and your children are always safe at this time

As our days are about to get longer, please remember that Duty of Care for the beginning of the day is at 8:30 am. Children should arrive at school after this time. Once they arrive, they can drop off their bags to their classroom, check in with their teacher and get ready for learning at 9:00 am. Please do not drop children off prior to 8:30 am.

DON'T FORGET TO READ TOPICS

Term 4 is jammed packed with activities and important messages for parents and carers. For example have you thought about next year? Is there new information about your child's learning we need to know about? Please make time to meet with me to discuss your child's learning in 2023. As mentioned in our previous TOPICS:

We have started to plan for 2023. We know that most families have stayed very connected to their classroom teachers. Teachers play an active role in placing students for the following year, through working closely with you and your children. They have a wealth of knowledge to support these decisions and will work with children to identify peers.

Throughout the year we know families invest in lots of outside support for children. If you have accessed an integrated service and have new reports and would like to discuss with me, please make an appointment through the front office. As we build relationships and connections with staff, we sometimes build hopes that our children will have certain teachers along the way. **All staff** provide positive experiences for our children and families, all staff collaboratively plan and all staff support all children's learning. We are so proud of the partnerships built and every new year brings a new opportunity to build relationships with new teachers.

IMPORTANT If your family is moving on from Trevallyn Primary School, please let us know. This supports our planning and we would love to know what you loved about Trevallyn and what we can continue to improve on.

Griff and Austin talked to us about the best thing about performing on stage!

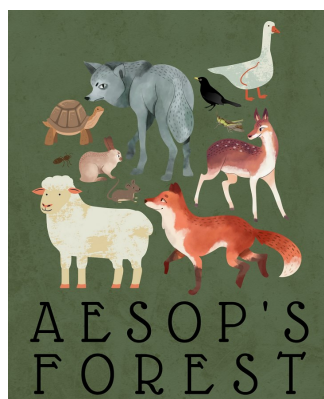
