If you have some wonderful blossoms, and would love to donate them could you please leave them at the front office on the following dates:



On Friday 25 November, a talented group of 5/6 students performed as part of Launceston College's Dance Fever Production- Impact.



3-4 RYAN/FLETCHER INQUIRY LEARNING JOURNEY

This term in 3-4 Ryan/Fletcher we have been on a learning journey to investigate how our behaviours have an impact on our environment.

We started our journey exploring what we thought an environment was and what our global and local environments might look like.

We discussed some of the human impacts on our global environment, such as burning fossil fuels, deforestation, mining and construction. We then turned to our local environment (our school) and conducted a survey during which we tallied the evidence of human impact on our school.

We graphed our results that clearly showed us food scraps were a significant problem. This concerned us as we knew that our local wildlife, such as our beloved magpies, could eat the scraps and become unwell as our food is not part of their diet, and that we could be composting our food waste rather than sending it to landfill.

We decided that we would write a persuasive letter to the City of Launceston to ask for kitchen caddy FOGO (Food Organics and Garden Organics) bins for each of our classrooms. We were successful and will be received 17 bins this week!

We also thought that we could benefit our local environment further by creating worm farms. We thoroughly researched worms and worm farms and created a number out of polystyrene boxes. We now put our fruit/veg break scraps in our worm farms and the "worm juice" produced will be used to fertilize the Kitchen Garden. Any remaining scraps will go into our caddy bins and our large school FOGO bins for collection. NO SCRAPS! NO WASTE!
