
# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### SO HOW CAN I HELP AT HOME?

Come along and CELEBRATE the efforts your child has made so far this year in their class and with their teacher. CELEBRATE the progress of learning, each year the Achievement Standards develop and require a new level of complex learning, it takes a lot of hard work to reach the Achievement Standards each year. Finally, when talking about school ask questions about the goals set, and what they are proud of.

# **HOW ARE WE SUPPORTING LEARNING AT SCHOOL?**

Our focus this year is on progress and how can we look at student data and work samples to create new learning, so all students continue to progress. All teachers meet fortnightly in small groups (called Professional Learning Teams – PLT) with their Team Leaders, they look at assessments and student work and plan the next steps for their classrooms. Our Team Leaders continuously examine student data and identify groups of students who need additional support and run intervention groups. This term intervention groups are being implemented across the entire school; I/2s – Anna Goss, 3/4s Rhona Stevenson and 5/6s - Jane Hudson. We will continue to monitor progress of student learning and support all students progress as a whole school.

# WE LOVE SEEING PAST STUDENTS AT SCHOOL

Having past students using the Basketball Courts or playgrounds around the school is what it means to be truly a community school. Especially when, the facilities are used with respect and safely.
