Tuesday 20 June: 3.30 – 4.00pm and 4.30 – 5.00pm



ARE YOU WONDERING WHY THERE'S SO MUCH TALK ABOUT READING AT TREVALLYN?

This week the Tasmanian Government released the Lifting Literacy Report. The focus is to improve the literacy of all Tasmanians:

"Being literate is fundamental to how we navigate our world. It can change lives. Improving literacy outcomes for Tasmanians is a whole-of-community issue that goes beyond the school gate. It must be a whole-of-government and community-wide effort. Being literate has a direct impact on individuals' success in life, health and wellbeing as well as being crucial to economic growth and productivity."

"Reading aloud and talking about what we're reading sharpens children's brains. It helps develop their ability to concentrate at length, to solve problems logically, and to express themselves more easily and clearly."

This is not why we are so focused on reading...

We are so focused on reading because at its heart, it is about connection; connection and interaction between a reader and an author. Connections to new worlds, people, characters, information and opinions. Reading is interaction between adults and children through the process and through the conversations. When our children have such strong connection, they can take on any challenge, they can "navigate the world", they have opportunity for strong lives, success and wellbeing. They are engaged and "fascinated", and their brains develop and neurons fire.

At Trevallyn, we want all our learners to be successful. For every year they are with us, we intend them to grow a year in their learning. We intend for our students to continue to improve, progress and find success in their learning through the strong connections they build with our community.

WE LOVE SEEING PAST STUDENTS AT SCHOOL

This especially happens when the facilities are used safely and with respect, exactly how they would be used during school hours. We understand that teenagers are not supervised by adults and that they need a higher level of autonomy. This does come with responsibility and accountability.

Over the past month, some past students have been seen using the school grounds in a way that could only be described as unsafe and disrespectful. This includes vandalising property and student learning.

We ask all families who are using our grounds to be respectful and safe. The behaviours that have been reported were extremely high risk and unsafe. Please check in with your high schoolers and support them with the expectations of using our facilities outside of school hours.

Protect others by keeping your child home if they're unwell. This includes if they have any cold or flu-like symptoms.


If you're concerned about your child's symptoms:
