
FROM THE PRINCIPAL..

YOUR CHILD'S REPORT

Reports are out this week. Remember there should be no surprises on how your child is progressing this year. Teachers celebrated and shared learning goals with you, in over 360 meetings. The learning goals shared are the next steps for your child. Overall, **all** Trevallyn students should be very proud of their efforts and growth so far this year. They demonstrate a great enthusiasm for learning, and we are seeing this right across the school.

When you receive your child's report, you will see that for English, Mathematics and Science your child's teacher has assessed their progress against the learning area's Achievement Standard for the year level.

A 9-point scale and worded descriptor will appear on your child's report for students in Years 1 to 6 (and **for Prep students at the end of the year**). The 9-point scale and worded descriptor assessment shows progress using the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standard established for children in every state and territory of Australia. *It does not compare your child's progress to other children in their class.*

The children (and staff) have worked exceptionally hard this term. It was a longer term than usual, and a lot was packed in. Encourage your family to have their own pyjama day for rest and recuperation. If you are travelling north, enjoy the sun.



READING CLUB AND READING BUDDIES

"Reading aloud every day helps fluency and also vocabulary. They have worked out new and unknown words."
