Safety Messages

- 1. It is so important for students to arrive after 8:30am, this is when we have our staff on Duty of Care.
- 2. Never use student toilets. If you need to use facilities, please come to the front office. No adult should be in student toilets at any time.
- 3. It is very important to respect the spaces utilised by ABACUS. They provide an essential service to our school. The primary playground, bottom basketball court, multipurpose area and quadrangle should be available to them exclusively from 3:15pm every day.

Drop off and pick up! Please ensure you cross the road at the crossing! As you are well aware there is a lot of traffic in the mornings and especially in the afternoon. Children's safety is our number one priority, so we ask:

- I. To show patience and slow down.
- 2. Always keep the drop off zone moving forward. Encourage your children to wait so you can move up efficiently to allow other cars into the Zone before they exit. Remember it is too unsafe for cars to go around you if you are parked at the end of the line.
- 3. Always, always, always cross at the crossing with Tony!

A huge thank you to all the wonderful Trevallyn community and staff who jumped in last Friday to support Tony. He is on the mend and we are looking forward to seeing him back at school soon. Thank you all for your kind wishes.


