FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Time flies!

As Term 1 finishes, we start to look forward to where to next with our students' learning, we create goals and establish how we are going to support each and every student to grow at least a year for every year they are at Trevallyn.

Did you know?... Our Year 6 leaders are supporting their peers and younger students to get better at reading? By reading every day, students get the chance to discuss what words mean, how authors create and build suspense, how to infer through comprehending and build vocabulary. This supports reading strategies and skills taught.

Did you know?... Teachers and staff use a range of information (data) to develop an understanding of where each student is at. Sometimes this means students need additional support to access and be successful in the classroom. Each of our team leaders (Ms Hudson, Mrs Ryan, Ms Stevenson and Mrs Goss) work with classroom teachers, use data and design special intervention groups to support students across the school. We are seeing great results already with a focus on improving vocabulary and comprehension to engage and achieve against the curriculum.

Did you know?... We are emphasising students' reading skills to support them to be GREAT writers. Students are examining language, literacy and rich literature as readers and using these techniques to be incredible authors. They are discovering how to take their wonderings and learning from Inquiry to communicate new thinking. We have a focus on engaging learner agency across the school.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL cont.

Did you know?... We are interested in deepening our understanding of how the brain learns and the role regulation and positive psychology play in learning. All our staff are being trained in the Berry Street Education Model with a focus on being ready for learning, having strong connections across the school, developing regulation strategies, a growth mindset and challenging ourselves.

Our School Captains presented to the School Association AGM last week. Kitty and Drew will attend the School Association each month and share the students' perspectives of what is happening around Trevallyn Primary School. We are very proud of our Year 6 leaders. Next term, with the support of the School Association, all our Year 6 students will engage in a leadership workshop that will support them to create the legacy they would like to have for their time at Trevallyn. This workshop brings together their ideas and aspirations for our school and gives practical ways for them to demonstrate their leadership. This work builds connection across the school for all students. We are committed to and passionate about learner agency and learner voice.

Next term we will be running a series of workshops to hear how you want to be involved. We want to hear your ideas and expertise in how to deepen your child's passions for learning through Inquiry, great writers and wellbeing for learning. Absence and Attendance

The Education Act (2013) requires that a parent of a school child must ensure that the child attends school each day. If your child will not be attending school, arriving late or departing early you are required to notify us with a reason. You can do this by using Schoolzine[®], emailing trevallyn.primary@decyp.tas.gov.au or phoning the school office on 6331 9657 before 9.00am.

Family holidays - We encourage families to organise any family holidays during the school holiday period to limit the potential disruptions to students learning during school terms.

Absent Staff

There is a possibility that teachers may be absent from school, when this happens the school makes arrangements for a relief teacher. Unfortunately, there are instances where we may be unable to secure relief, in this situation classes will be split. If a teacher will be absent for a long period, such as long service leave a letter will be sent home with students in that class.

Allergy Aware School

If there are students in your child's class with specific food allergies, you will be notified prior to starting school. We have a number of students who are anaphylactic to nuts and for this reason we request that nut products such as peanut butter and muesli bars containing nuts are **NOT** brought to school.

Assembly

Teachers will contact parents directly with an invitation to attend. Parents and guardians are required to sign in at the multi-purpose room and put on a visitor sticker. Parent and guardians are asked to not film or take photos during the assembly. If you wish to collect your child during assembly, please notify the office before 1.00pm.

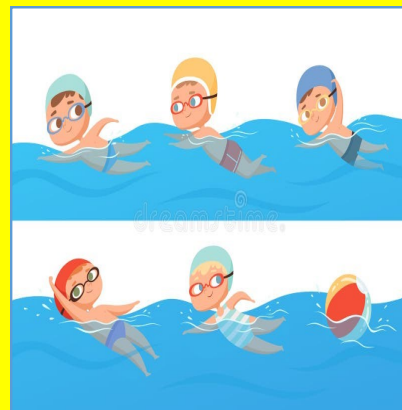

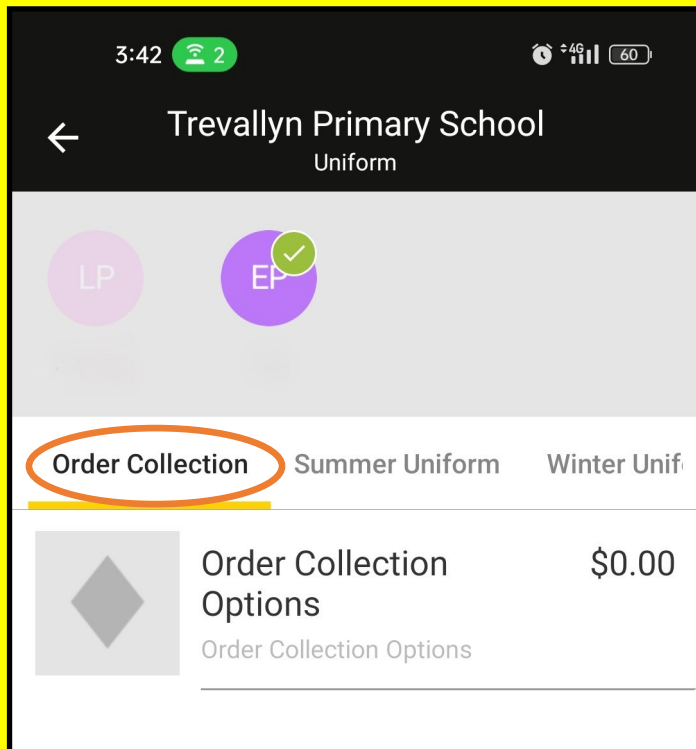
