Jump Rope for Heart kicks off this term at Trevallyn.

Jump Rope for Heart is one of Australia's most loved physical activity and fundraising programs. It's designed to get students skipping to good health while raising funds to help the Heart Foundation fight heart disease.

That's important because:

- · One in four 5-12-year-old are either overweight or obese
- . 80% of students are not getting the recommended amount of daily physical activity
- Physical activity makes you less likely to have a heart attack and can help prevent and manage over 20 chronic diseases including some cancers, type 2 diabetes, and depression
- Heart disease is Australia's biggest killer.

The program will be most successful if you can help:

- Promote Jump Rope for Heart
- Get students skipping
- · Encourage them to sign up to fundraise online.

This year we've got an audacious goal to see our student Heart Heroes to log 40 hours of skipping throughout the program!
