Learning about Numbers in the Early Years of School

Learning numbers is arguably the most important strand of Mathematics, as an understanding of number underpins all mathematics through the rest of school and throughout life. For this reason, developing strong understanding of the number system is a priority in the early years of learning.

During the next few weeks we will look at early counting skills and learning place value.

One-to-one correspondence

Once children can name numbers, it is time for them to learn to count. The first part of this learning is that each item in a group gets its own name and is only counted once. Placing items in a row initially can help children so they can keep track of items counted. Encourage your child to use their finger to touch or move the items they have counted. Teachers call this one-to-one correspondence as one item has one number attached to it.

Activities you can do with your child:

- Line up objects and have your child count them while touching each one as it is named
- Put a small group of objects down and have your child count them encourage them to line them up or to slide each one to the other side as they count them
- Counting a number of catches as you throw a ball to each other
- Count the stairs as you climb them
- Count things in the shopping trolley
- Count toys back into a container

Again take opportunities to count as they arise and let your child hear you count.

National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence

Teaching children about bullying is ideally embedded within the curriculum. Learning about feelings, social interaction, diversity, social structures, discrimination, justice, power and conflict provides opportunities to explore the issue of bullying, why it happens and how to prevent it. Learning about bullying within everyday classroom activities reinforces school values related to respect and inclusion. It also communicates to everyone that bullying is never okay.

Friday 16th March is the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence. Trevallyn Primary School will mark the National Day of Action.

Researchers, both in Australia and overseas, have identified a combination of broad strategies most likely to be effective in preventing and reducing bullying.

What Works

- * A universal whole-school approach over a long duration that takes a multifaceted approach rather than focusing on one single component.
- * An increased awareness of bullying in the school community through assemblies, focus days and student-owned plans and activities.
- * Encouragement and skill development for all students (and especially bystanders) to respond to bullying behaviour and support students who are bullied.
- * The promotion of a positive school environment that provides safety, security and support for students, and promotes positive relationships and student wellbeing.
- * Effective methods of behaviour management that are consistently used.

We also need to work with our students in unpacking what bullying actually is. The term "bullying" is quite often used however, the behaviour that may have occurred actually be mean or rude behaviour, not bullying. By unpacking this with students we can address and empower our students by providing them with the tools and strategies to address these different behaviours.

When someone says or does something unintentionally hurtful and they do it once, that's RUDE.

When someone says or does something intentionally hurtful and they do it once, that's MEAN.

When someone says or does something intentionally hurtful and they keep doing it even when you tell them to stop or show them that you're upset - that's BULLYING.

If you would like more resources or strategies and tips to support your child, the Bullying No Way is a valuable tool you can access at any time.
