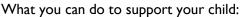

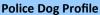

**Inside Out 4 Kids** is an organisation which aims to assist children through the grief process when confronted with a painful loss or transition in their lives and/or families. When something significant happens in a family, everyone is affected, including the children. Because of young age and short life experiences, children often find it difficult to verbalise their feelings. The **Inside Out 4 Kids** is specifically designed for primary and high school students and is a peer support, harm-prevention program, offering a safe place to understand and share their feelings. Small groups of students meet with a trained adult facilitator once a week for 45 minutes during school hours and participate in activities including stories, talking, sharing, and craft. The following topics are covered:

Week 2	- Emotions and Feelings - We all have feelings	
Week 3	- Emotions, Feelings and Anger	
	What makes you feel angry, directing anger appropriately.	
Week 4	- My Heart, Grief & Loss- What's inside my heart, share our changes or loss	
Week 5	- Memories & Moving on- Growing around the loss, share memories	
Week 6	– I Belong, A Sense of Self Identity – Where do I belong, Who am I?	
Week 7	- Courage & Resilience - What worries do I have, How to build resilience	
Week 8	- New Horizons, Hope & Helping Others- Help with problem solving & change,	
	learn to have hope and happiness, help ourselves heal and grow	

Week 8, being a celebration, often includes a small morning tea or lunch, a gift and a certificate. As the program is sponsored by Launceston City Mission, there is no financial cost to you or the school.

#### 2018 PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE



Trevallyn Primary School Students are getting behind the 2018 Premier's Reading Challenge to promote reading and literacy across the school!

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) encourages students from Prep to Year 6 to read 10 books in 10 weeks and can be integrated with existing classroom reading programs.

This year, the Challenge begins on Monday 9 April and ends on Friday 15 June 2018.

By encouraging children to read, the Challenge aims to:

- Inspire children and young people to love books and reading
- Raise parent and community awareness about how important reading is as a life skill
- Encourage families and parents to read with their children every day

It's not a competition, but a challenge to each child to read, to read more and to read more widely, regardless of their current reading level.

### For Parents - encourage a life-long love of reading.

## The Premier's Reading Challenge encourages your child to read 10 books in 10 weeks:

- Sign your child's PRC reading log for the first 10 books they read during the Challenge.
- Make sure your child shows their log book to their teacher regularly during the Challenge and especially after they read their first 10 books. They must return their log book to their teacher by Friday 22 June to ensure they receive a certificate signed by the Premier and a prize pack.
- Take up the Challenge to read and explore books together.
- Talk about books with your child.
- Make reading a family affair.
- Encourage your child to submit a book review.
- If you have the time and hold a current Working with Vulnerable Children card, why not volunteer to help your child's school by listening to students read?
- Join your local LINC or library where you can borrow a great range of books for FREE.

#### **EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL - PATTERNING IN NUMERACY**

Learning about patterns is another important strand of Mathematics, for children to understand. Sorting, classifying and recognising patterns is a way that children make sense of the world around them and is an essential skill for future work in data analysis and Science.

#### **Patterning**

**One** of the reasons that humans have been so successful in their survival is because we are so good at recognising patterns. We know that the sun will rise and set each day. Our ancestors recognised the seasons of the year and they organised planning of their crops to fit.

Modern Science and Mathematics depends highly on pattern recognition and the ability to recognise patterns is necessary even in high level mathematics. Much of this ability is learnt in early childhood. This helps them to learn how to use logic and reasoning to make predictions. Knowing what has gone before and what will come next is very important in their daily lives and is essential in mathematics and science. Patterning also helps with language and is essential in music.

Activities to do with your child:

- Sing nursery rhymes these help with patterning, language, rhythm and music.
- Tell stories that have an element of repeat to them, that are predictable so that the children can tell you what comes next.
  - We're Going on a Bear Hunt
  - Sniff, Snuff, Snap
  - The Little Red Hen
  - Who Sank the Boat
- Encourage your child to make patterns using rubber stamps, paw prints and footprints, making necklaces from beads, shell or pasta.
- Play clapping games.
- If you are at the beach look at patterns of footprints on the sand. Make patterns with your feet.
- Find items in the park or garden to make a pattern, such as leaf, leaf, stick.
- Make patterns as you walk, hop skip and jump.
