#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

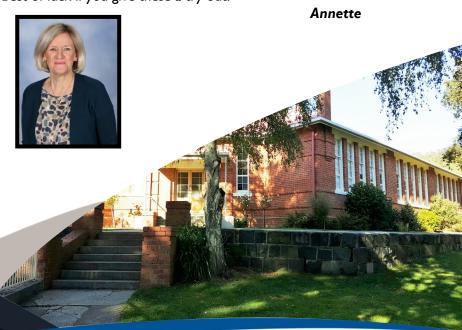

#### **EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL - MATHEMATICS**

#### **The Operations**

Only after children have learnt to count and they have become fluent counters and understand the written form of numbers, they can begin to learn about the operations – learning to add, subtract, multiply, divide and so on.

#### Teaching children to add

Teaching children sums involves some very abstract thinking, therefore in the early years of schooling we teach children to add using materials so they have something concrete to use. Manipulating and seeing numbers represented is vital to building understanding. Two amounts can be represented – such as 4 teddies and 3 teddies and the children will be asked how many altogether.





Initially students might count all the teddies (one, two, three, four, five, six, seven – seven – there are seven teddies) but later we will move the children towards using more efficient strategies. Initially, they need to become accustomed to the idea that adding means joining the amounts together.

#### Activities to do with your child

- Play games with dominoes that require children to add both sides of the domino together
- Use counters, beads, pebbles, blocks etc. to practice adding (How many altogether?) with two groups of single digit numbers that initially add up to 10 or less.
- ♦ Look for natural opportunities to add items: "Look, there are 3 pieces of carrot on your plate and 5 on Dad's plate, how many are there altogether? What if I count Dad's first?"
