#### **EARLY YEARS OF SCHOOL - MATHEMATICS**

#### The Operations

Only after children have learnt to count and they have become fluent counters and understand the written form of numbers, they can begin to learn about the operations – learning to add, subtract, multiply, divide and so on.

#### Teaching children to subtract

Teaching subtraction is largely done in the same way as teaching addition. Teachers start with an understanding of the concept of subtraction. So rather than starting with two amounts and 'joining' them to work out how many altogether, children start with one amount and model 'taking away'.

For example:

If I have 8

and I take 4 away (move away but still so the child can see what was taken)

then I have 4 left.

Eight take-away four is four.





#### Activities to do with your child

- Use a plate. Explain to the child that there are 5 blocks on the plate. I am going to take 2 away. Ask how many altogether and assist your child to count back as each extra block is taken away. (we have five, now four and now three.) The child can then check what is in their hand and see that they have taken two away. You can use different materials and of course, different numbers, but we only encourage counting back by three at the most.
- Use any opportunities that arise to naturally count on from numbers to model to your child. "I have seven spoons here, we only need five for our cereal, so I can put some back." Count back as you remove them one at a time. "So I have seven, six, five, I need to put these two back in the drawer."

#### **MID-YEAR REPORTING 2018**

Mid-Year Reports will be going home with all Prep to Six students on Wednesday 4 July. The Mid-Year Reports provide parents with an assessment based on the descriptions below for English, Mathematics, Science and Humanities and Social Sciences. It reflects their progress and achievement against the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards. It also provides Future Focus areas to assist your child in achieving the best possible outcomes in their learning.

Mid-Year Reports for Kindergarten students went home on Wednesday 20 and Thursday 21 (depending on your child's days). These reports consist of a short general comment and the Kindergarten Development Checklist I.

Below is a guide to assist you with your understanding of your child's assessment.

Assessment Scale				
A - Well above the standard expected	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.			
B - Above the standard expected	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.			
C - At the standard expected	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved the expected level of competence in the processes and skills.			
D - Approaching the standard expected	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.			
E - Below the standard expected	The student has elementary knowledge and understanding in a few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

#### **UNIFORM SHOP NEWS**


As of Term 3 there will be a price increase to some items in the Uniform Shop. The paypal fee will also cease.
