FROM THE PRINCIPAL

On Monday our teachers had an opportunity to participate in professional learning, grade and sector planning. We were all introduced to blended learning and CANVAS, new Department of Education technology and approaches. These incredibly rich resources are very innovative and will assist both student and teacher collaboration. Our Grade 6 students and Mrs Stevenson have been ground breaking at TPS as they are using this technology for the sharing of their work in the Write Road program. This virtual learning environment is perfect for the required online discussion boards, the required communication, critical thinking and feedback. There is so much to learn, but working together will be encouraging and supportive for us all.

This week we **farewelled our Social Worker Keryn Geard**. We thank her for her support of our school and community and wish her all the very best with her new position. Keryn has made contact with many parents and students to inform of a transition to a new Social Worker. When an appointment is finalised I will let everyone know.

Levelled Literacy Intervention (LLI)

LLI is a small-group intervention program at TPS designed for young children who find reading challenging. It has been highly successful in achieving its goal of bringing students to year-level performance. Lessons are at least 3-4 times a week, for 40 minutes, with instruction in reading, writing and phonics/word study. The small size of the group allows close observation and promotes individual learning.





FROM THE PRINCIPAL CONTINUED

During Term I and 2, 15 children accessed the LLI program. All of these students improved their reading level. At the end of Term 2, 4 students exited the program, having reached a grade appropriate reading level. During Terms 3 and 4 our priority is to support the literacy needs of our Prep students as well as the LLI program continuing to support children in Grade I and 2.

The support of parents, the efforts of the students and the highly committed teaching and ongoing monitoring of students by Mrs Cramp and Mrs Bird are highlights of LLI. All involved should be very proud.
