#### NRM NORTH BUSH SIGNAGE PROJECT

Last year, 5JH were lucky enough to be involved in a project with NRM North where we created signage for our native plants in our bush playground. The process involved in this project was great fun and took our class approximately 3 months to complete. Firstly, we started identifying our native plants in the bush on a tour with Anna Povey. We learnt a lot about the plants and their location in the bush. We were then assigned groups and started researching in greater detail our group's assigned plant. We needed to find the scientific name of the plant, the properties the plant provides our local fauna and how the plants were traditionally used by Indigenous people. We also had the sketch the plant for labelling. Once we had sourced all of our information we sent it off to be printed for signage. We then got to paint the posts, screw on our signs and show Jason and Chris where our signs needed to be erected. Last term, we launched our bush signage and took teachers and classes on a tour of the bush to visit the signage and share our process and information about the plants with the students. We also held a tour for our parents and community members in the afternoon. We would like to thank Al Hugo and Anna Povey for the support and guidance throughout the project and NRM North for the sponsorship in making this possible.
