THE POWER OF PLAY - AT SCHOOL

Play provides opportunities for children to learn as they discover, create, improve and imagine. When children play with other children they create social groups, test out ideas, challenge each other's thinking and build new understandings. Play provides a supportive environment where children can ask questions, solve problems and engage in critical thinking. Play can expand children's thinking and enhance their desire to know and learn. Play can promote positive dispositions towards learning.

Play is an integral aspect of learning in our Early Years classes. Teachers are responsive to children's strengths, abilities and interests and through play, playful pedagogies and intentional teaching they are able to support learning. Teachers engage in shared conversations with children to extend their thinking. They provide a balance between child led, child initiated and teacher supported learning. Play is not just for recess and lunch times, play has a central role in learning and by creating a culture that values "play", we value the core tenets of play: taking risks, making mistakes, exploring new ideas and experiencing joy.

Our Book Week Parade will be held on Thursday 23 August at 10:30am in the Quadrangle.





